Dr Ulrike M Vieten “Anti-Gender Discourses & European Far Right Populisms”

Lecture Series: “Equalities, Citizenship & European (Dis)integration”

Friday 14 December 10 am, Location AM 104

This lecture offers an analysis and critique of notions of gender in the arguments of recent far-right extremism and discuss the links of anti-gender campaigns as they are evolving with the Christian far right in different countries.

Dr Vieten is a QUB Fellow at the Senator George Mitchell Institute for Global Peace, Security and Justice; from mid of March 2019 she will be based at the School of Social Sciences, Education and Social Work at Queen’s University Belfast (Northern Ireland). Her research engages theoretically and empirically with the (de-)construction of racialized, classed and gendered group boundaries, particularly in the context of nationalism, cosmopolitanism and the shifting axes of difference and otherness. Her focus is on Europe, processes of European socialisation and the emergence of multi-layered transnational identities. She has published widely on racisms, gender, and more recently on far right populism.
